Jesus taught the people "with authority" – he cast out demons "with authority". How did the people recognise that Jesus had this authority?

Sunday Mass Times – For some time now, the bishop has been encouraging parishes to reduce the number of Sunday Masses as the availability of priests decreases with retirement. When Bishop O'Donoghue instructed that the 8.30 am Mass at Calder Vale be discontinued he didn't expect us to transfer that Mass to Bonds. He asked that it be reviewed in 12 months with a view to discontinuing. Bishop Michael has asked me on a couple of occasions what the outcome of the review has been. Our Liturgy & Spirituality Group did this review before Christmas,

and at their most recent meeting recommended a change. From **Sunday 15th March**, therefore, there will only be one Mass on a Sunday morning at 9.30 am. Please note this. There is Mass at 9 am at Claughton, and 10.30 am at Scorton, if occasionally you need an earlier or later Mass.
