NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR A)



Jesus reveals in many ways to his disciples that he is not just an ordinary human being, but that he is also divine. He is able to refute the ordinary laws of nature which dictate to us all how we live. The laws of nature were created by God and the Son of God is able to control or override them.

He set up the circumstances of the revelation of his power to his disciples, over some of the

laws of nature in today's gospel. He wanted to show them that no matter what nature and the circumstances of life might throw at them, he would always come to them and be with them, and bring peace and calm to their lives.

The way that he showed them his power over nature couldn't have been more dramatic. The disciples were in the boat. Some of them were very experienced fishermen; they were very used to the squalls that can blow up very quickly as the cool evening air causes dramatic and dangerous conditions over the warm waters of the Sea of Galilee. The arrival of Jesus and response of Peter to join Jesus walking on the water, sets up the dramatic experience of Peter and the disciples – one that they wouldn't forget.

Jesus was revealing himself to be their Saviour – the one who could rescue them from mortal danger and who would bring peace and calm into their turbulent lives. The sign he gave, to teach them to trust him, couldn't have been more dramatic.

Peter's cry as his faith, his trust in Jesus, foundered: "Lord, save me!" was so fundamental to his relationship with Jesus. Jesus was overtly and obviously his Saviour. Jesus held out his hand and caught Peter as he sank and brought him to the safety of the boat. In the boat the rest of the disciples, threatened by the ferocity of the sudden squall, were suddenly surrounded by calm as Jesus and Peter joined them. They were surrounded, in the stillness, by the power of God – this the disciples dramatically recognised: "You are truly the Son of God!"

In the calms after the storms and squalls of life, we find ourselves knowing the presence of Jesus our Saviour. We bow down in adoration and acknowledge Jesus as our Lord and Master.
