FIFTH SUNDAY IN LENT

JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY



The Pharisees judged the woman and condemned her. Jesus judged her and forgave her. The Pharisees were all sinners themselves, judging a fellow sinner and condemning her. Jesus had never sinned. He judged a sinner but did not condemn her.

You would have thought that sinners, like the Pharisees, would understand a fellow sinner; you would have thought that sinners who knew that they themselves deserved to be punished, would be lenient with a fellow sinner. You would have thought that Jesus, who had never sinned, would lack understanding as to what it was like to be a sinner,

and would be harsh in punishing a sinner.

But, no!

Jesus is without sin, yet understands the woman perfectly. What he does is to call her to sin no more. He asks her to change – and he doesn't do this by punishing her, *he does it by forgiving her*.

This is how he calls us to change, calls us to repentance. He calls us to change by forgiving us! How do we respond to this amazing love and compassion? By going out and sinning again, falling back into our habits of sin!

How we need the Sacrament of God's forgiveness! How we need to hear the Lord say to us: "Neither do I condemn you." We need the constant experience of the Sacrament of God's Forgiveness, the experience of hearing the priest say – with the voice of Jesus – "I absolve you", "I forgive you of your sins" – "I do not condemn you. I welcome you back into my merciful love", "I hold you in my arms – you are my dearest daughter, my dearest son; I love you". We know how we have just confessed the same old sins again. We know it's only a few weeks since we last came to confession and here we are again, confessing the same old habits. And yet Jesus tells us with as much love as he has always had for us: "I do not condemn you, I forgive you, I absolve you. Go and sin no more?"

And, with God's help we go from the Sacrament with hope.
