# 11<sup>th</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR B)



Back to parables this week in the Gospel. Though we look upon parables as something unique to the New Testament, they do occur in the old as well, and their purpose is more than making a difficult topic easier to understand. (Oh, if only the Evangelists had left us Jesus' interpretations!)

'Parable' is a Greek word, and means a wise saying or a maxim, and there are quite a lot in the Gospels. Counts

range from 35 to 72, depending on how you separate parables from similes or metaphors.

The parables as we have them are a lot less straightforward than we might suppose. No one doubts that they come from Jesus himself, but the early Church seems to have adapted them by creating new settings for their utterance. "Experts" suppose that collections of parables existed before the compilation of the Gospels and there was either no setting for the separate parables or a setting that was already artificially constructed. To complicate matters further, some parables seem to have been expanded by the addition of a saying of Jesus which may originally have been in some other context.

Why should this be? Well, the parables were originally used to introduce the concepts of the mystery of Jesus' person and the coming of the Kingdom to an audience whose knowledge of them was previously non-existent. But as time went on, the early Church saw opportunities to adapt them to its own preaching needs. It perceived a meaning for the parable in its own life and the life of the individual Christian which was not explicit in the original form, but all the themes used were originally in the teachings of Jesus and any adaptations or expansions have not concealed or distorted them. If Jesus had come in the 21<sup>st</sup> century, the stories would have been quite different, but the message would have remained the same – and what is the message? Well, the central characters in the parables normally call to mind Jesus or the Father either separately or together. The love of the Father shown by the sending of his Son is the great revelation brought by Jesus. This is the function of the parables – to show the perfect completion the New Kingdom confers on the plan of God for the world.
