Good Friday Morning – Scorton – Following the normal tradition, on Good Friday morning, there will be Stations of the Cross (time to be announced). We will then link with members of both the Anglican and Methodist communities and partake in a short procession of witness within the village. The procession will be headed by a life-sized cross, carried by a parishioner, and then erected in a prominent position overlooking the village, where it will remain during the Easter period. Following the erection there will be a very short united service lasting around 10 minutes. Garstang parishioners are most welcome to join us.

Easter Day at Scorton – Another tradition, to which parishioners at Garstang are cordially invited to join: parishioners of the three Christian traditions in the village have for a number of years got out of bed rather early (time to be notified) and have assembled at the junction of Snowhill Lane and Higher Lane, Scorton, by the stile leading towards Nicky Nook. The assembled group then climbs Nicky Nook, arriving at the summit in time to see the rising sun peep above the Bowland Hills (being symbolic of the Risen Christ). A short service with a couple of hymns takes place, before those in attendance make their way back to the Methodist Chapel, Scorton, for bacon baps and tea/coffee. (Donations to cover costs are most welcome.) Suitable clothing and footwear should be worn and a torch for use during the ascent is always a good idea.
