

# 26th / 27th July 2014

## **SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**



Today's Gospel is the conclusion of the parable chapter that we have read over three Sundays. There are three parables (but only an explanation of the last one) and then a conclusion addressed to the disciples.

As in the case of the Sower, which we heard about a fortnight ago, where the field grew everything sown, so the net holds everything it envelopes. The theme of the parable is wisdom, just as the other two are, but of a different sort. This is the wisdom needed for the long haul

in Church or Mission. It recognises that life seldom delivers unmixed blessings. The net contains all sorts of fish; fine specimens of recognised species that will get a good price at the auction, but lots of little unwanted ones. The value of the good fish will outweigh the bad, but the sorting can only be done when the net is drawn to shore.

Matthew probably had the Gentile Mission in view in using this parable. We can occasionally romanticise the picture of the early Church by concentrating on Luke's presentation in the Acts of the Apostles, of an ideal community of one mind and heart, persevering in prayer and holding faithfully to the apostles' teaching. Matthew is a great deal more realistic and his Church resembles the one we are familiar with, containing some people of heroic virtue, a majority who try their best, and some that the virtuous might want to write off as no-hopers, weak-willed, unyielding. Matthew here resists any effort to get rid of them. The Wisdom of the Church is not as wise as the Wisdom of the Kingdom, so the final sorting out must wait until the angels undertake it on Judgement Day.

And the Scribe praised for bringing out treasures new and old? Probably directed at the community's teachers who are able to draw on both the traditions of their ancestors and the new experience brought by Jesus, treasures new and old.
