SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT



The Hebrew people, who had been taken into exile by the Babylonians in 507 BC, began to be released and allowed home about 538 BC – they had been exiled for some 60 years. Their return to Jerusalem was a time of great joy. The few remaining residents of Jerusalem, who lived in the ruins of the city, are told by God in our first reading to

“Arise, Jerusalem, stand on the heights
and turn your eyes to the east;
see your sons re-assembled from east to west
at the command of the Holy One,
jubilant that God has remembered them.”

The prophet, Baruch, continues to tell the remnant of the people in the city, that the mountains will be flattened and the valleys filled in so that the people can return on level ground, “walking in safety under the glory of God”.

John the Baptist, the last prophet, spoke in the same way: the ground will be levelled and the rough road made smooth so that “all mankind will see the salvation of God.” At last, the people will not just experience *the glory of God*, but they will know God as the one who *saves them* from all that drags them down, from their own sin.

We are getting ready to celebrate, once again, the birth of the one who saves us. We remember that we have a God who has never abandoned us, who has never left us in the dark. We have a God who happily wants to walk the ways we walk and wishes to accompany us as he envelops us in his love.

The Lord is reminding us in Advent of something we know well, yet something we so easily let slip lightly from our consciousness. The immanent and the immediate become so distracting.

We ask for the grace to take a moment to know that the Lord comes to save us.

Come Lord Jesus!

The Jubilee Year of Mercy Pope Francis has proclaimed an Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy to run from 8th December 2015 to 20th November 2016. “It is my burning desire,” says Pope Francis, “during this Jubilee, that the Christian people may reflect of the works of mercy;” the corporal works of mercy: to feed the hungry, to give drink to the thirsty, to clothe the naked, to welcome the stranger, to heal the sick, to visit the imprisoned and to bury the dead; the spiritual works of mercy: to counsel the doubtful, to instruct the ignorant, to admonish sinners, to comfort the afflicted, to forgive offences, to bear patiently those who do us ill, and to pray for the living and the dead. We have much to do in this Year of Mercy! May we welcome this year with courage and joy! Lots more to come!

Why not join the Choir? – The choir is an integral part of every Christian church. When we sing we pray in a way which enables us to savour the words we use, giving glory to God more effectively. The ambience of God’s house results from many factors, but none is more powerful than that of liturgical music. This requires a choir dedicated to producing a programme of music consonant with church tradition and liturgy. There is far more to

this than simply plucking popular tunes out of the air! Good churches invariably have good choirs. If our parish is to remain good, it must sustain a good choir. Please think seriously about joining your choir. It is necessary to have some sort of voice, but despite so many claiming total lack of singing ability, there are very few people who honestly cannot sing. No ageism is involved; all ages are welcome and there are no “screen tests”! All we ask is commitment. These days we see so much half-heartedness and apathy in the Christian faith we should treasure; joining the choir could be the first step in remedying this. *Dr. Carter*
