**JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY**

Each time the gospel of Martha and Mary occurs, it causes slight unease: is Martha misunderstood and presumed upon, working her fingers to the bone while others take their ease in talk? The Old Testament parallel is a famous scene from Genesis, when Abraham receives three mysterious visitors. There also, it is the man who receives them while his wife and servants make the meal for the visitors to eat.

In the latter case, it is not to be judged by today's standards – it was, after all, the patriarchal age. In the case of Martha and Mary, we can say we do not know the circumstances – perhaps Martha was, indeed, trying too hard to impress. *The Liturgy Planner*

“Few [things] are needed, indeed only one.” The Responsorial Psalm tells us what it is: living in the presence of the Lord. Abraham responds to this presence with a prayer: “Lord, do not pass your servant by.” Jesus answers this prayer by accepting the hospitality of Martha and Mary. To offer hospitality to the Lord is to centre ourselves on his presence, rather than on the distracted contents of our minds. Saint Paul acknowledges the purpose of what has been entrusted to him: “to do what I can to make up all that has still to be undergone by Christ”. Christian stewardship demands stillness, silence, and attentiveness before the Presence. To those who choose the better part, God is able “to show all the rich glory of this mystery”. *Magnificat*

**Did you know....**before the beginning of our *Hands On* project in Kitui, Kenya, the community were at breaking point? There was no water for growing crops, and the little drinking water available often carried disease and took hours to collect. Over the past two years, people in England and Wales have been funding an extraordinary project to provide water for thousands of Kitui residents. It hasn’t been an easy task, and has involved a complex combination of tools and training. Water has seeped back into the daily lives of the families in this community and has transformed life for the people of Kitui.
