temptation, but deliver us from evil.

Fr. Anthony: Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously

grant peace in our days, that, by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from

all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the

coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ.

ALL: For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours

now and for ever.

Fr. Anthony: Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles, Peace I

leave you, my peace I give you, look not on our sins, but on the faith of your Church, and graciously grant her peace and unity in accordance with your will. Who

Communion is given silently in the hand only, with the communicant standing, and avoiding any physical contact. When the priest approaches, they should do so with arms at "full stretch" so that there is a good distance between the priest and the communicant. Their hands, palms upwards, one of top of the other, should be extended as flatly as possible.

SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

My Jesus, I believe that you are present in this Holy Sacrament of the altar. I love you above all things and I passionately desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, come spiritually into my soul so that I may unite myself wholly to you now and forever. Amen.
