#### Musings from my hermitage ... Fr Geoffrey

Waiting's a fact of life and, often enough, shot through with anxiety: we wait for exam marks, hospital results, a phone call; we're anxious about our children's future, the health of an ageing parent or our partner. We wait expectantly and, sometimes, in fear.

The expectancy of Advent's just as mixed. We listen to readings about the end of the world and last judgement, and wonder how that's 'good news'; how is it something to look forward to? The First Sunday of Advent continues the imagery of the last few Sundays. The scripture readings still speak about "the last days," about waiting, but the mood's changing. The spirit of the liturgy is moving into waiting not in dread, but "in joyful hope for the coming of our Saviour."

Isaiah and Matthew were speaking to communities who'd grown tired of waiting in hope, who'd begun to give up on God's promise; lose their zeal for the ways of the Lord. Isaiah and Matthew affirmed the ancient prophecies: despite the long haul, God will fulfil the promise. So stay awake and stand ready, says Matthew; wake up, live decently, urged Paul; the nations will gather to worship God, declared the prophet, and war will be no more.

What response does God's word seek from us? We can be so caught up with the busyness of living that we've no time for God's vision, no energy to sense the Advent of our Saviour.

But life is about living fully the present moment; it's the only moment we have. The past is gone; we cannot use the future; and every present moment can be one of waking to God's presence and action: "Now is the favourable time. This is the day of salvation." Not after we've sorted out the garage, written the cards, cleared the desk; but now, while we're sorting the garage, writing the cards, beavering away, and pottering about.
