Musings from my hermitage

This Sunday we celebrate the final feast of Christmas — the Baptism of the Lord. Over the Christmas season, we have celebrated not only the birth of Christ, but those events which unfolded God's vision for all to see: how Jesus was shown to the world at the visit of the Magi; how John the Baptist recognised Jesus and pointed him out as the Saviour. In the baptism of Jesus, God anointed him for the work he was entrusting to him.

But why did Jesus need to be baptised? He hadn't committed sin; there wasn't a church to join. St Mark doesn't say why. But this is where Mark begins his gospel: no angels, no shepherds, no stable or kings. What was important to Mark was the tearing of the heavens, that the voice of God shows who Jesus is. Mark allows us to overhear the secret voice only Jesus heard: "You are my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on you."

Jesus was changed in his baptism. Now he began to preach and heal, call people to transform their heart. Mark lets us in on what those around Jesus couldn't see; shows us the significance of all that'll follow: "You are my Son."

Already Mark is guiding us to the heart of the matter: our Lord's baptism, ... his transfiguration, ... crucifixion: Mark describes all three in the same way.

As St Mark's gospel unfolds over the course of this year, the focus will be the person of Jesus. The crisis point will be the challenging question: "Who do you say I am?" The heart of Mark's gospel is Peter's confession of faith.

Jesus has trusted the Church – trusted us – to make him recognised and known, and honoured as Saviour; to continue the work he began at his baptism: transforming hearts and minds in the love of God.

Our baptism marked each of us for life, and God-with-us is still with us in the thick of it all.
