Musings from my hermitage...

An interesting character, St Paul. We're listening to his second letter to the Church in Corinth, and last week we celebrated him and St Peter. Paul was the adventuring missionary, venturing far and wide around the Mediterranean world.

His letters and the Acts of the Apostles record that St Paul experienced failure and attacks, on his person and on his methods and strategy. Yet he trusts the God who says: "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness."

God works through our weakness to reveal Christ's power within us. What marks us as true Christians, is that that we don't forget our weakness, that we're aware that it's Christ who strengthens and sustains us. Whatever gifts and talents God has given us, are given not to enhance our standing in the eyes of others, but for us to use to serve Christ and his gospel.

Paul believed that in all his suffering, he was reflecting Christ. When Christ was at his weakest on the cross, there especially he manifested the power of God. Paul knew that it was in his very weakness that he was most like the crucified Christ, and that in his weakness God's power shone. Paul was confident in his heart that, despite his limitations and the enormous challenges he faced, Christ would provide the gifts he needed, not despite his weakness, but through it.

Just like Paul, we want rid of our weakness and sin and, just like Paul, we beg God to take them away. And when God seemed not to grant Paul's request, Paul was led deeper into the mystery of God's love for us: "Your grace is sufficient for me, Lord, for your power is made perfect in weakness". That's not the sound of someone who's given up, who feels rejected; it's the prayer of someone strong in hope. The challenge is to let God be God, acknowledge our limitations, our weakness, and know that, somehow, those too are part of God's plan: "For when I am weak, then I am strong."
