Musings from my hermitage ... Fr Geoffrey

Caught in a storm, situation out of control, facing death.

St Matthew used this episode to speak to the members of his community in their own struggles. They were Jewish Christians; oppressed, regarded as heretics, persecuted.

Matthew used particular words to help his fellow Jewish Christians see Jesus as the one who uniquely reveals the God of Israel. What does Jesus say? "It is I" — God's name in the Hebrew scriptures. Peter notices and calls Jesus "Lord". "Lord, if it's you, tell me to come to you across the water." Not the lake or the sea, but the water. And Matthew's people would have recalled the Book of Genesis and the waters of creation. And when Jesus put out his hand to hold Peter, Matthew's people would have recalled the many times in the Scriptures where God lifted his servant from the depths of despair.

For St Matthew, Peter represents the whole Church. Peter's faith is neither perfect nor absent — it's weak. (Sound familiar?) Peter had some success, then had to learn to live with failure. (Ring any bells?) But for all the disciples' weakness, for all Peter's "little faith," they do come to understand who Jesus is: "Truly you are the Son of God." They worship him.

The disciples were in trouble because they were isolated from Jesus: he was in the hills, they were far from land, and they'd been out there all night.

We discern God moving through our life through daily prayer; we hear what the Lord God has to say by reflecting personally on the scriptures; celebrating the eucharist together and faithfully keeps us fixed on the kingdom of heaven.

The more faithful we are to each of these, the closer we'll remain to Christ, in what can sometimes be a long, dark night.
