Musings from my hermitage

The disciples had been transformed by meeting the risen Christ, by their communion with him. Transformed: not back to what they'd been before holy week. They were new: people of faith, with a zeal for the mission their Lord had entrusted to them. That kind of faith wasn't comfortable or cosy; it uprooted people and impelled them to places they'd never been.

We've heard that the disciples were "united heart and soul;" that they testified "with great power." It's the same for us. The more we are "united heart and soul," the more we are able to testify "with great power." This is the faith into which we were baptised; which we affirm in the eucharist. And the ultimate focus of the Mass — for which we pray — is the transformation of ourselves into "one body, one spirit in Christ", "a living sacrifice in Christ to the praise of [God's] glory."

Faith in Jesus Christ stretches us, demands that we reach out, and with confidence: to the lonely and the unloved; to the poor and the many in need. Sometimes we might think the disciples had it easier than we do. If only we'd seen our risen Lord, then we'd really believe, be totally committed. Today's gospel tells us otherwise. We don't know Christ in the flesh as the apostles did. And people today in our neighbourhoods, our schools, homes, and places of work, they can't know Christ as the apostles did, either. But they can encounter the risen Christ in you and me; glimpse something of his risen life in our life, and in our parishes: through the evidence of our care, and community; in our faithfulness to worship and personal prayer; how we seek to build and affirm relationships, heal wounds, assist one another in our frailty. This is our faith. This is the faith of the Church.
