Musings from my hermitage

The feast of the Assumption began in Jerusalem, sometime before the fifth century. It was called the "Falling Asleep of the Mother of God," the "Dormition"; and that's how it's called still by Christians of the Eastern traditions. The feast focused on Mary's death as her sharing in Christ's victory over death, the paschal mystery. Later reflection made Mary's entrance into God's kingdom explicit; images were drawn from the Bible to point to Mary being "lifted up" into heaven. It was in Rome, during the eighth century, that the feast became known as "the Assumption."

We celebrate Mary's passing over, body and soul, from this world to the glory of her risen Son: and that's the destiny of all who model themselves on Christ. When we look to the fullness of God's gift, to the vision God sees for all who believe in Jesus, there is Mary — with Christ now in the glory of heaven. Mary said 'yes' to God out of love, and in a spirit of service. Pope Paul VI called her "the first and most perfect of Christ's disciples". Mary's discipleship is the pattern for our own.
