Musings from my hermitage ... Fr Geoffrey

Forgiveness: a brilliant idea. Not always easy in practice, whether that's to forgive someone else, or to accept forgiveness oneself.

The dramatic parable of the unforgiving servant rounds off St Matthew's portrait of what it means to live as members of the Church.

The basis of all relationships within the Christian community is forgiveness.

All of us live under the forgiveness of God. Christ died and rose again, won forgiveness of sin, and is Lord of all the living and the dead. We are baptised for the remission of sins; in the celebration of the eucharist our sins are forgiven; in the sacrament of reconciliation, and the sacrament of anointing.

This is the blessed context in which we live, rich with the mercy of God. If God places no limits, we'd be fools to do so: if I set limits on forgiving others, I'll have limits placed on my forgiveness by God. It's as simple — and as stark — as that.

Is it always possible to forgive, to show mercy? I can't imagine how I'd feel if my child were run down by a drunk driver, or interfered with, or if I were maimed by a terrorist. Nor is it always easy to accept forgiveness, to let go of our guilt and live.

If that's where we find ourselves today — struggling to forgive, or finding it hard to accept forgiveness and live — then from that place let's pray to our loving and merciful God. Give thanks for God's mercy; and pray for the grace of a true spirit of forgiveness.

At the very least, it means disciplining ourselves to think the best of one another, resisting the temptation to presume the worst. That's the bedrock of the communion of Christ's disciples, and the measure of our desire to become the people God has in mind.
