Increasing our capacity at Garstang

Following last Saturday evening's bumper attendance — thank you! — and that on the previous Sunday — thank you! — we need to increase our capacity. Following our Bishops' guidance and in consultation with our Health & Safety Lead, we have removed the tape from all the benches to allow people to distribute themselves throughout the whole building, including the chapel. Ideally, I would have put something in the newsletter this weekend alerting you, and implemented it the following weekend, but I'll be away that weekend and I didn't think that was appropriate.

In these changed circumstances, please:

- be mindful that others might be more cautious or apprehensive than you;
- respect the space of others;
- avoid crowding one area of the church when there is space elsewhere;
- if one bench has a number of people in it, choose another.

Our Bishops ask that we continue to:

- sanitise our hands;
- wear face-coverings unless exempt: we owe it to others to be prudent;
- use the Track & trace QR code or paper slip.

If last Saturday evening / Sunday morning proves to be typical, then Saturday evening will be the busier of the two Masses by far: 110 v 70. But if the capacity of the church is c.350, then 110 – including couples and family groups – will mean that there is good deal of space for people to spread out. If you're able to attend on Sunday morning as easily as on Saturday evening, please do, to help even the numbers across both Masses. Thank you.

Communion. We will continue our present practice: please wait to be directed by the stewards.

Collection. There is a basket at the back of church for your offerings.

Stewards. Heartfelt thanks to our stewards in both churches, whose service has enabled us to open our churches for public Mass. We will continue to have stewards, not least as a welcoming presence as we enter church.
