Musings from my hermitage ... Fr Geoffrey

St Matthew's gospel reminds us that life in the kingdom is something God gives, not something we achieve, or deserve.

Whose kingdom is it? God's. Whose place is it to invite or to exclude? God's. St Matthew wants us to recognise the sheer gift of God, and let God be the basis of our entire life.

Last Sunday in the gospel, our Lord called us "to think better of" how we respond to God, because the gift of faith is to be life-giving for others, not merely be a comfort for ourselves.

In this Sunday's parable, our Lord's point is: see how desperate those tenants were to get their hands on the inheritance; they stopped at nothing, not even murder.

Well, we don't need to cheat or murder to obtain God's gift. God offers life in the kingdom freely, and to all. Our Lord's pleading with us to accept the gift; and the Gospel still calls us to live the gift of faith to the full, in every aspect of our life.

St Matthew uses the parable also to challenge religious leaders. Those who would lead God's people are to minister with zeal and integrity: otherwise the kingdom of God will be taken from them and given to people who do produce its fruits.

All of us are challenged by our Lord's parable to ask ourselves: What's the quality of my membership of the Church, Christ's risen body? What fruit do I produce? Daily prayer; daily seeking to become more like Christ in every aspect of our life; that's what will produce the fruit of the kingdom of God. The rest is in God's hands.
