The Parish? The Now and Future Church

This ACTA National Conference will take place through Zoom, **Saturday 22 October**, 10.30am-4.30pm.

This year's Conference will examine the role and function of the parish in a technological, post-Covid world. How will our sense of parish be shaped by our experience of synodality? What changes are needed for the parish to be the prophetic voice in our communities? How do we manage ministry in a parish in the coming years?

Communion from the chalice

One of the many great gifts of renewal of the Second Vatican Council was reintroducing the option of receiving Holy Communion from the chalice, faithful to our Lord's command at the Last Supper, "Take this, all of you, and drink from it."

Receiving Holy Communion in this way has been common in our country for the last several decades. Until Covid.

We have had no guidance from the bishops regarding the re-introduction of communion from the chalice, and I suspect that it will not be forthcoming.

Beginning the weekend of 22-23 October, whenever possible, and in both parishes, the chalice will be offered to members of the congregation (who will be free to receive from it or not).

Remember, though, that when the rim of the chalice is wiped with a clean purificator after each communicant, the vast majority of bacteria are removed. Wine also has a disinfectant quality, as does the precious metal of the chalices.

At Garstang, also beginning the weekend of 22-23 October, we will resume our pre-Covid distribution of Communion: I and a Minister will stand in front of the main altar, two Ministers will stand before the Lady Altar. You are invited to process to Communion beginning at the front of church and returning to your place via the same aisle. For the first few weeks, our gallant stewards will assist in this.

Receiving from the chalice: As when receiving the Host, please make a bow of reverence before receiving the Chalice. After responding "Amen" to the Minister, take the chalice securely in both hands, take a sip, and hand it back to the Minister. I'm conscious that several of our younger parishioners have made their First Holy Communion when we were unable to offer the Chalice. If they are now going to do so, may I ask their parents to prepare their children to receive in this way, as described just above.

Additional ministers: In both parishes, additional Ministers of Holy Communion would be very welcome. Perhaps you've previously served elsewhere, or haven't served before. For Garstang, contact Frank Miller, for Scorton, contact Denise Morley.
