#### Bishop Paul on the crisis in Sudan

It is over 500 days since the start of the civil war in Sudan. The war has escalated; approximately 150,000 people have died in the fighting, and more than 10 million have fled their homes. Aid agencies are struggling to deliver the food needed to prevent mass starvation.

Bishop Paul, Lead Bishop for Africa for the Bishops' Conference, has expressed his solidarity with the people of Sudan who continue to suffer the effects of war.

## **New Lectionary**

The Bishops of England & Wales, and Scotland, have authorised a new edition of the Lectionary – the collection of scripture texts used at Mass and in the celebration of the sacraments, funerals, and so on. This comes into use on the First Sunday of Advent.

The copies have now arrived and are on display in church for you to take a look. In Garstang, they are on the altar rails; in Scorton, they are on the table at the back of church. The cost of the lectionaries is £590.75; the Book of the Gospels is £233.75. Any donations would be very welcome. Many thanks indeed to the parishioner who has paid for the lectionaries at Garstang.

As well as expanding the collection of readings to include recent saints and feasts that have been added to the calendar, our bishops have decided to use a different translation to the one we have been using. We will now have the *English Standard Version*, which I understand to be a conservative updating of the older *Revised Standard Version*.

Interestingly, the Bishops of Ireland, after consulting the parishes, opted to produce a new edition of the Lectionary with Australia and New Zealand, using the latest version of the *Jerusalem Bible* translation that we have been using for the last fifty-five years.

Several publishers are advertising hand Missals for your personal use: Hodder, Redemptorist, CTS. Those of you who like to have your own might like to wait a year until any editorial or proof-reading errors have been corrected. In the meantime, for weekdays there is the *Magnificat* publication, for Sundays there's the *CTS Sunday Missal 2025*. Fr G
