Musings from my hermitage ... Fr Geoffrey

The Scripture readings this Sunday urge us to live with meaning. Look at the third slave in the gospel: he protected what he'd been given, buried the money, kept it safe. But the master had been looking for something else, something imaginative.

"Here's your one talent back." That wasn't the point. That wasn't why the master had entrusted the talent to him. The slave hadn't been a good steward. He hadn't invested himself; he didn't give back with increase.

In contrast, look at the capable wife in that first reading; the trustworthy slave in the gospel. They both have wisdom. The proverbial capable wife managed her family and her business and cared for those in need. The trustworthy slave produced ten talents out of five. What imagination they must have had; what courage, persistence. What risks they must have taken. So where are we in this picture?

Christ our master has given gifts and talents to each of us. He expects us to be responsible for what he's given; dares us to become the people he knows we truly are: children of light, children of the day; whose obedience to God's vision isn't surly or grudging, but courageous and imaginative because we know ourselves to be securely grounded in God.

God has chosen us to help create that vision. No single one of us has the blueprint, and each one of us has a unique role. Each has a contribution that no one else can make — because what we're asked to give is ourself.

Christ in St Matthew's gospel urges us to grasp the big picture, be confident in our faith, courageous in how we witness and serve. The God who took our flesh and blood did so that all people might be saved. That's the plot, and each one of us is a part of it.

Now. What gifts and talents has God entrusted to you? What's God looking for from you? How will you use your gifts and talents to build God's vision?
