## Musings from my hermitage ... Fr Geoffrey

St Matthew portrays Jesus as someone who's clear about his priorities, and clear about how we human beings will be judged.

In this Sunday's parable, both groups were surprised: no one on right or left had noticed Jesus. They all ask, "Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty?" God will judge the nations, will judge every human being — whether they profess faith in Jesus or not — by how they served those in need.

Christ himself knew what it meant to be without. He saw the ravages of illness and disease; he was himself arrested and tortured. He urges us to respond to these needs in others, as he did.

You and I are to have the mind and the heart of Christ, and we'll be judged accordingly. Did we take care of the most pressing problems of the needy? Did we address their hunger, their thirst, the problems of being a foreigner; disease, captivity?

The insignificant, the poor and the forgotten, the "least" of the world: wherever they are, that's where we find the shepherd-king of the gospel. And whenever you and I serve the "least," we are serving the Christ who will be our judge.

The grace and gift of baptism enables us to hear the quiet voice of our Shepherd, calling us onto the right path, leading us home.

And along our way, the grace and gift of baptism empowers us faithfully to serve the least of the brothers and sisters of Christ our King.

#### Stand up, and smile

A cross-party group of MPs from the three main parties in the UK Parliament is bringing forward the Abortion (cleft lip, cleft palate and club foot) Bill. The Bill will change the law to clarify that cleft palate, cleft lip, and club foot are not grounds for abortion in the UK.
