Musings from my hermitage ... Fr Geoffrey

The fragility of human existence has been much before our eyes this year: close to home, in families of our parish; across the world, in many countries. On the global, political stage, there seems to be an inability or unwillingness to get to grips with the challenges and trials that beset so many folk on the planet.

Through all this, the Christmas Scriptures tell us that permanence, security, meaning is to be found not in institutions or empires, or systems, but in the One whose birth we celebrate, born among a people forlorn and oppressed.

Because the Word was made flesh in Jesus, the Christian faith is very physical. At its heart is the marriage of heaven and earth in Jesus, the communion of God and creation in Jesus. So the human, tangible, and social context in which we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ is an integral dimension of the Christmas festival.

For some of us here, our circumstances, health, or well-being may be much changed from this time last year. ... Some are rejoicing over a new member of the family; others are mourning the loss of someone, who's died, or gone away. Christmas doesn't always feel like 'Christmas.'

And yet this is the world into which the Christ was born. Not some tinted, air-brushed version, but this world. ... It's in this world and in our very human hearts that Christ longs to live. God made flesh, God-with-us, sharing our life and our struggle. ... That's why the mystery of God made flesh in Jesus embraces every one of us, every human being across the face of the earth, whatever our experience and situation, however we feel. God-in-Jesus can touch us in the heart and depth of it all. Only God-in-Jesus can bring the consolation and healing for which our human spirit so deeply yearns.
