Coronavirus: updated instructions from our Bishop The Bishop has issued the following instructions in addition to those from last week:

- Advise those most vulnerable (elderly, people with weakened immune systems and long term conditions like cancer, diabetes and heart disease) to refrain from large parish gatherings and stay at home.
- Suspend catering (teas, coffees etc.) at large parish gatherings where multiple people touch mugs, utensils, biscuits etc.

As was said last week, the sign of peace at Mass is suspended; Holy Communion from the chalice is suspended; everyone is encouraged to receive Communion in the hand; Holy Water stoups are empty; Ministers of Communion will sanitise their hands before distributing Holy Communion, and we will pick up our own copies of hymnbooks and missals. Finally, our own personal responsibility: for the good of all, and especially those among us most at risk, everyone, please wash your hands thoroughly and regularly in hot soapy water, use tissues in which to sneeze or cough. If you have a noticeable cough or cold, it might well not be Coronavirus but, at this time especially, it can be unsettling for those around you in church so stay at home, ... especially if you have a standing order! Please pray for all who are ill with the virus, all medical staff, and those working in medical research. *Thank you, Fr Geoffrey*.

The advice can be found at: <u>https://www.cbcew.org.uk/wp-</u> content/uploads/sites/3/2020/03/COVID19-Guidelines-3-090320-1648.pdf **In light of the Bishop's last point**, I think we have to suspend tea & coffee & biscuits after Sunday Mass in both parishes, suspend the Whist & Dominoes, and also suspend the Wednesday coffee mornings. Although these aren't "large parish gatherings", these events take place in tight spaces, and multiple people are touching mugs, utensils, biscuits etc. Also, during this time of concern, Mass, Morning Prayer, and Rosary at Garstang will be in the main church, rather than in the Plessington Chapel. This will enable us to have the recommended space between us. *Thank you. Fr Geoffrey*.

The Breaking of the Bread – In the official instructions for celebrating Mass, we are encouraged to use bread that the priest is able to break into parts and distribute to the congregation. The use of larger breads will foster an awareness of the fundamental Eucharistic symbolism in which the whole assembly, priest and people, share in the same bread. This breaking of bread, which gave its name to the Eucharist in the days of the apostles, expresses more clearly the sign of unity of all in the one bread, and of the sign of charity by the fact that the one bread is distributed among the brothers and sisters. (See 1 Corinthians. Beginning on the Third Sunday of Lent, 14-15 March, in both parishes we'll be using the larger breads you will already have seen me use. This also enables us to have as few vessels on the altar as possible and enhance the symbolism of the One Bread, broken and shared. *Thank you. Fr Geoffrey.*
