Musings from my hermitage ... Fr Geoffrey

This feast of the Holy Trinity invites us to reflect on the mystery of God, three-in-one. But what images to use? What pictures?

We're familiar enough with the three-leaf shamrock. It's vivid, and matches the richness of St Patrick's writing.

Over the centuries, all manner of image has been offered, to give the Christian people ways into the mystery of God, three-in-one.

God has been likened to a constant spring of water, giving life. Or a rainbow, whose colours are distinct, yet cannot be separated.

A famous ikon from the Eastern church shows the Trinity as three angels seated around a table — pure companionship.

This is the image that's foremost in my mind and heart just now. On Tuesday, for the first time in fifteen weeks, I shared a meal with another person. Friends were passing through, and we enjoyed lunch together in my garden. Not exactly three angels around a table, but it was very good.

Through all the many and varied experiences of our life, be they wonderful or uncomfortable, within each of us God nurtures a response.

Week by week we respond to God in our worship and our personal prayer; we put flesh on our response to God through our care and support of one another; and we put spirit into our response to God by our persistent attention to the needs of the many, those who really struggle to find meaning or sense in their life.

We do compromise our response, of course; give it partially, hold it back. But if ever we dared to set loose our God-given energy — in our worship and prayer, in our support and care for others — our response will take us far beyond images of shamrocks, or rainbows, or angels round a table.
