Welcome back to Mass

Changing guidelines. Following the Government's easing of restrictions on 17 May, our Bishops have revised their directives for parish life and worship. From the point of view of the congregation, these are the things that you'll notice. Thank you, Fr Geoffrey.

- Readers no longer need to sanitise their hands before and after reading.
- We will resume the personal dialogue at Communion with each communicant: "The Body of Christ. Amen." Please note that facecoverings are still required.
- At Garstang there will be an additional minister of Holy Communion.

If you're fairly recently returned to Mass: welcome back; it is good to see you once again. You might wish to take a copy of the *Order of Mass* to enable you to pray the Apostles' Creed and, perhaps, to say the *I confess* as part of your own preparation for Mass. Mark the copy with your name, and retain it for your personal use.

Receiving Holy Communion

When receiving Holy Communion, please:

- Make a bow of reverence before receiving the Sacrament.
- Have your palms open one on top of another, forming a throne.
- Have them as level as possible and relaxed.

Musings from my hermitage

The feast of the Holy Trinity invites to us reflect on the mystery of God, three-in-one.

When Moses wanted the people to reflect on the nature of God, he called them to remember what God had done for them. There had been no other god like their God, who'd performed marvellous deeds for them. The God they'd come to know wasn't distant, but one whose voice they'd heard, who'd chosen them, and freed them from slavery.

We, too, worship the God who's chosen us, who loves us, and not because of anything we've done. God has formed us into a believing people; walked with us through the ages, and remains with us still. God continues to reach out to us in our personal prayer, our reading of the scriptures, and in the eucharist, inviting us in our turn to "take it to heart [that] the Lord is God indeed, in heaven above as on earth beneath, ... and no other."

Let's heed Moses' counsel: remember God; look over our life, notice the moments life tested us, and recall how God sustained us. Acknowledge where we haven't fulfilled the grace of our baptism, and how God still reached out to us and enfolded us in a merciful embrace. Remember, too, the love others have shown us, people who are living signs of God's love and tenderness.

We gather together to worship the mystery of the risen Lord's presence in our life; and even if we doubt — doubt our gifts, doubt our confidence and ability — we are still ambassadors for Christ. And Christ is with us always: in his gospel, in this sacrament of the eucharist, and in the heart of all God's children "scattered throughout the world". Let us take heart, together.
